The Department of Gender Studies at Queen's University invites applications from suitably qualified graduate student interested in teaching a course in *HIV/AIDS Movements (GNDS 320/3.0)*. This is an on-campus, upper year lecture course with an expected enrolment of 60 students. Candidates should be enrolled as a Ph.D. Student and be at the ABD stage. This is a winter term appointment for the period January 1, 2012 to April 30, 2012, with classes in session from January 9, 2012 to April 6, 2012.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals.
